CONGRATULATIONS TO PROFESSOR NEWHOOK

Readers will no doubt be pleased to learn that one of our members, Professor Frank Newhook, was recently awarded a Doctor of Science degree by London University for research of international importance over a considerable period, some 90 publications produced over nearly 40 years. Much of his work has been with Phytophthora cinnamomi, a plant pathogenic fungus, which is a major cause of economic loss in temperate and sub-tropical countries throughout the world. - Ed.
