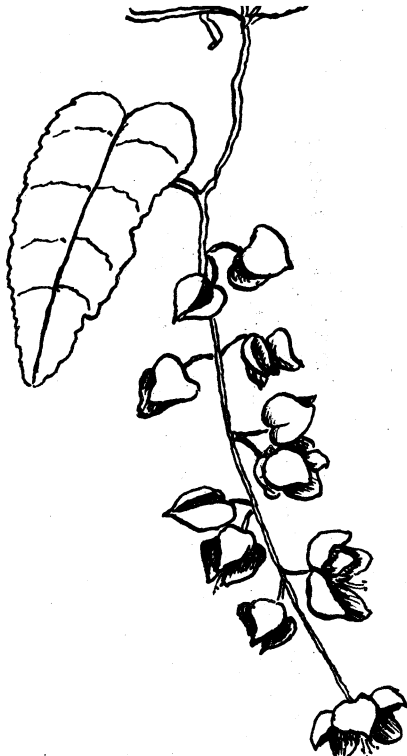
Readers could hardly have failed to notice a change in the style of printing, this edition being produced on an offset duplicator. One advantage of this new method is that now contributors will be able to check that their articles have been typed correctly before they are printed. Perhaps professional botanists can be less reluctant to contribute something or these pages now that articles can be checked for accuracy. On the other hand, an important aspect of the ABS Newsletter is that it provides for the amateur botanist and production standards should not be so high that amateur contributions are no longer comfortably accommodated. It is hoped that the production of this Newsletter achieves a happy balance; not too scruffy nor too flash.

The drawings on the last page serve two purposes. First, to enable readers to re-read "Botanical and Horticultural Highlights of Fiji" by Marie Wood Mays in ABS NL 35, this time with the accompanying drawings. These drawings were available in 1980 but they reproduced so badly on the pencil duplicator. Secondly, to illustrate that drawings can now be reproduced well, which may encourage contributors to illustrate their articles.

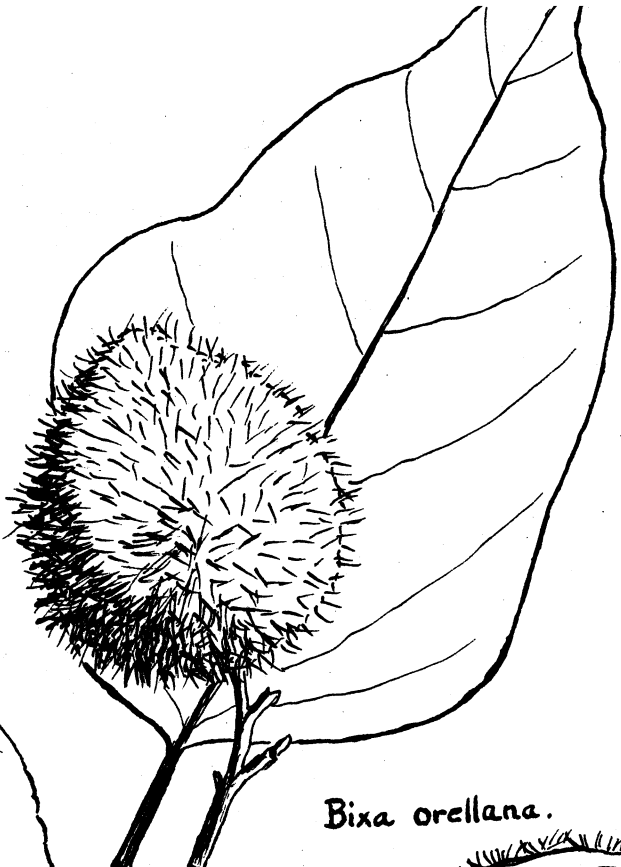
Pedilanthus tithymaloides.

Mimosa pudica.

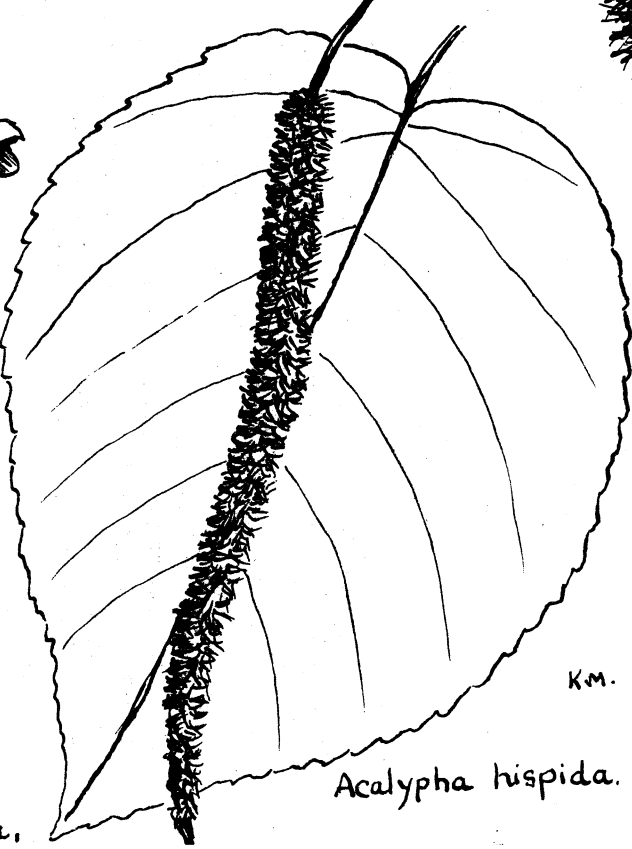
