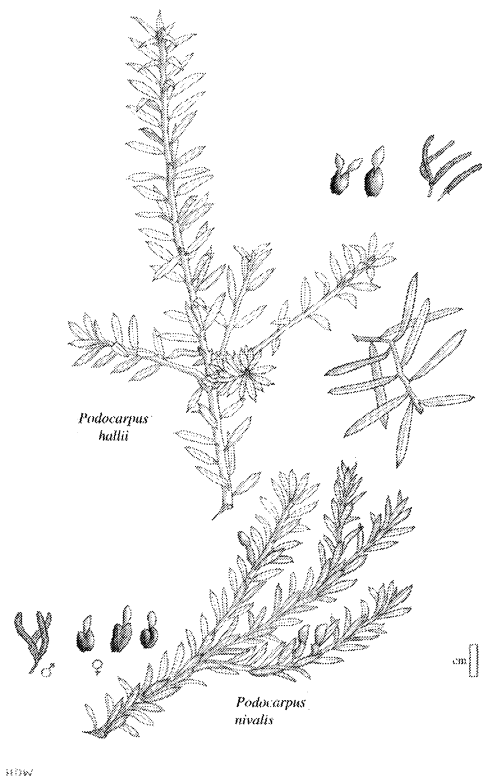


SESSION 2: RESTORING AND ENHANCING NATIVE VEGETATION

Thin-bark tōtara, *Podocarpus hallii*, and snow tōtara, *P. nivalis*.

Since Allan's Flora was published in 1961, three of the seven species he treated as *Podocarpus* are now generally accepted as belonging to *Prumnopitys* (mataī and miro) and *Dacrycarpus* (kahikatea). The four species of tōtara remain within a more strictly defined concept of *Podocarpus*. Brian Molloy, who worked extensively with native conifers, outlined these name changes for us in a short Botanical Society article in 1982.
